While Southeast Europe (SEE) has traditionally been spared from severe water scarcity and drought-related challenges, there is a growing trend of concern. Permanent water shortages are emerging in some areas, and droughts are becoming more frequent. Our project has investigated how climate change trends will likely impact water availability in various subregions over the coming decades and identified the most suitable and promising adaptation and mitigation measures from multiple options. The findings have been compiled into a manual. During the workshop, we will introduce the manual, share key results, and open the floor for discussion on the conclusions and recommendations.
