The DRPC: The Legal Basis of Danube Cooperation

October 1998: DRPC comes into force

2000 & 2007: EU Water Framework and Floods Directives (speaking the same cross-basin language

2004: Creation of the ICPDR Public Participation Expert Group

June 2004: Danube Day is celebrated for the first time
